
Troy Referral Pathway: All Referral Sources



Law Enforcement screens all arrestees for opioid use/overdose risk and saves form in arraignment packet. The court coordinator reviews these packets daily to identify clinically and legally eligible cases, then flags the file for the judge to review ahead of arraignment

As a precaution, the Court Coordinator reviews packets for everybody attending arraignment the next day to identify eligible individuals that were not identified in the initial process





Defense



If an individual was flagged by Law Enforcement but was not identified as a potential opioid court participant by court staff prior to arraignment, defense can make a referral

Opioid Court Entry



At arraignment, the Peer meets with individuals flagged by Law Enforcement to talk about the court program. The peer and/or court coordinator conduct an eligibility screen.

The peer also interacts with individuals as they await arraignment to get new individuals that might not have been flagged prior to arraignment. Opioid Court Entry
